Last year when Mariah Blake's father Chad signed her up for Youthlinks, neither of them knew exactly what was in store for Mariah other than a "gardening experience". "I knew nothing about gardening but the money (student stipend) interested me, at first", Mariah shared.

An incoming high school junior, Mariah shared, "I learned a lot more than gardening at Youthlinks. I definitely learned how to communicate better and I gained self-confidence."

Mariah's father echoes that observation. "The biggest change in Mariah is confidence. Mariah went through a few tough years in overcoming some challenges and Youthlinks played a big part in that change. She has created friendships here and has been able to help others by volunteering with the Youthlinks group at the soup kitchen." Youthlinks Student Garden Army members also donate hundreds of pounds of food to the local food cupboards and look forward to selling produce locally beyond the farm stand this year.

Mariah feels her plans for her future have changed as a result, too. "After high school I would like to do something with plants, I love plants. I am also interested in the possibility of becoming a kindergarten teacher or an Emergency Medical Technician. I would say to others who are thinking about coming to Youthlinks, 'Go for it'. It is such a good way to learn and they teach you so much. You learn the skills you need to become an adult. It's a great program and they share a lot of different life values. You think when you start that you are just planting a garden, but there is so much more. For me, I can talk with people more easily and have gotten over the 'stage fright' of meeting and talking with people."

Chad Blake is not only a Youthlinks father, he is a Youthlinks Grassroots Garden customer. "I stop in on Wednesdays and buy out the cucumbers." The Youthlinks Farm Stand is open every Wednesday at 420 Broadway in Rockland from 9 – 11 am from mid-June to late August. Youthlinks is an out-of-school hours program for middle and high school students in the greater Rockland area and is a service of Broadreach Family & Community Services. The program is free of charge for participants.
